# From Vision to Action: Non-Profit Organizations Making a Difference in Education, Healthcare, and More

National Nonprofit Day is commemorated on August 17 each year to recognize nonprofit organizations' ongoing efforts to serve their local communities. Last year, the Salisbury-Rowan Community Action Agency, Inc., served 696 individuals and families in total.

89 individuals received tuition assistance for vocational training. 46 individuals completed educational studies that included skills training certifications and degree programs. 111 completed training in financial literacy, parenting, and other life skills. 303 children received education and cognitive development services for kindergarten readiness. Infant and toddler dental services were provided, along with health screenings, literacy skills, and nutrition.

Additionally, 9,734 hours of service were donated by volunteers in support of the families that our agency serves. Thanks to the generosity of donors, SRCAA, Inc. received \$411,770 in contributions to help us in our

fight against economic insecurity among our community's most vulnerable population.


### SERVICE OF COMMUNITY TOP PRIORITY
